

KENTUCKY DISTRICT CAMPGROUND RULES

Junior & Conquerors Camps

Rev. 2007

General:

1. All Campers must complete the registration form and have the recommendation of their United Pentecostal Church pastor. If they do not attend a UPC church they must have the recommendation of a United Pentecostal Church pastor.
2. All Campers must obey all rules and guidelines established by the Kentucky District Board UPCI and respect all lines of authority established by the Camp Director. Campers will be subject to discipline or dismissal by the Camp Director if they do not obey the rules and guidelines.
3. All Campers must leave after the final service except where special permission is granted by the Camp Director.

Conduct:

3. All Campers shall be required to attend all class sessions and evening services.
4. All Campers must remain in the Tabernacle after the evangelistic service until permission is granted to leave.
5. No Camper is permitted beyond the boundary established by the camp in session.
6. No Camper is allowed to leave the campground without the approval of the Camp Director, Department Secretary, or Camp Principal.
7. Campers are not to stay in cottages without an adult counselor officially approved by the department in charge.
8. Campers are not to visit or be present at any time in a cabin or dorm where members of the opposite sex are present or reside.
9. No Camper is allowed outside of sleeping areas after lights out.
10. No Camper is permitted to stay on the campground without being enrolled.
11. Campers shall respect all Camp property, and are responsible for any damages.
13. Campers are required to eat their meals in the cafeteria at the approved time.
14. Campers must turn in car keys and cell phones at time of enrollment.

Behavior:

15. Campers shall not engage in handholding, kissing, or any such activity.
16. No taunting or ridicule of other campers is allowed.
17. Acts of violence will not be tolerated, and shall be cause for dismissal.
18. Smoking, drug use, drinking of alcohol, or any such activity, is not allowed.
19. Vulgar language, profanity, and/or cursing are not allowed.
20. No videos, worldly music, or Christian Rock music will be permitted in the dorms.
21. Campers will keep their personal items in order.
22. No fighting (pillow, shaving cream, toothpaste, towel, etc.) will be allowed.

Personal Appearance:

23. Female Campers:

- A. Girl Campers must have all dresses or skirts decent and below the knees. Splits in skirts or dresses must be or pinned below the bend of the knee. Excessively tight clothing will not be permitted.
- B. Dresses and blouses must have a modest sleeve length and necklines must not be revealing.
- C. Clothes must cover midriff area at all times. Shorts and slacks are prohibited.
- D. Clothing with suggestive writings or pictures will not be allowed.
- E. The use of lipstick, make-up, or jewelry (earrings, rings, necklaces, bracelets, piercing) will not be allowed.
- F. Pregnant females will not be allowed to enroll as a camper.

24. Male Campers:

- A. Boy Campers must have decent haircuts before arriving on the campground. Hair must be off the collar and the ears. No facial hair will be allowed.
- B. The wearing of plain white t-shirts solely or pajama pants will not be allowed outside the dorm. A belt must be used with baggy pants and under clothes must not be seen.
- C. Clothing with suggestive writings or pictures will not be allowed.
- D. The use of make-up or jewelry (earrings, rings, necklaces, bracelets, piercing) will not be allowed.

Rules for Non-Campers:

25. All persons on the Kentucky District Campground are under the jurisdiction of the Officials of the camp in session.
26. All non-campers shall leave the campground nightly by the time determined by the Camp Director.
27. All Staff members are expected to abide by the same rules and guidelines of the campers.
