Adriane taught in the Bible school and also worked in the mobile print shop, printing tracts and doctrinal materials for the UPCI of Cameroon. In September of 1998, the Riddicks received their missionary appointment to Cameroon. During this term they assisted in the ground work of sending the first regional missionary from Africa to the country of Equatorial Guinea. Due to illness, they returned to the U.S. where they worked on year at Tupelo Children's Manson and later assisted Rev. D. A. Lewis in Marshall, Texas, for 3 years. <p>Tuttle, Michael - Regional Director Europe/Middle East</p> <p>Bible quizzing and International Youth Corps served as the forerunner for Michael & Dianna Tuttle for their missionary experiences. September 1975 - 1976, began their first year of missions work under the Missionary Helper Program. In 2010, they will have served 29 years in missions with the UPCI. Prior to going to Europe, they ministered in Beaverton, Oregon, and served as sectional youth director. In 1982-1984, Brother and Sister Tuttle were AIMers to the Military Ministries in Baumholder, Germany. In 1984, they were appointed as missionaries to the Netherlands, and in 2002, Brother Tuttle was appointed as the Western Europe Area Coordinator. In 2008, he was also appointed as Interim Europe Middle East Military Coordinator. Since being in Holland, the Tuttle's have established The Holland School of Ministries that trains individuals for the ministry. The UPC of Holland has sent a provisional "regional missionary" to the Democratic Republic of Congo, who is working with the UPC of Congo in the capital city. Nine months later a door opened for them to serve as furlough replacements in Malawi. They received their missionary appointment to Malawi in October 1984. Arriving in Malawi they found a young church that was immature but evangelistic.
